#### A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome and welcome back.

Firstly, after feedback from parents, it was felt that the usual cycle for newsletters, being Weeks 3, 6 and 9, needed to be changed for this term given the amount of news that needs to be communicated at the commencement of a year. So, this is more an information newsletter, rather than a publication which shares and acknowledges achievement.

I'm sure that you have all received information from your child/ren's class teacher already in relation to significant information and dates. So much of what is in here may be known to you but alternatively, some might be 'new news'.

I would like to extend a big welcome to our new Reception and new students and their parents/guardians to Bordertown Primary School. Bordertown has a fine reputation and a proud

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history and we look forward to you assisting in developing a future we can all be proud of.

#### **School Day Hours Trial**

As a consequence of further information coming to light, we are trialling different classroom times. The yard times for drop off and pick up have not changed but due to circumstances beyond our control, classroom times have had to change. Basically, the day has been split into 6x50 minute lessons with some time still allocated to classroom care and eating times.

Students now enter class at 9am with break times still occurring close to times they have been in the past. The lessons are split into blocks of two - prior to recess, prior to lunch and prior to dismissal. The current structure is in place for three weeks with a review to be undertaken by staff on Wednesday the 15th of February. Please feel assured that drop-off and pick-up times will not change in the short to medium term.

#### **Pupil Free Day**

Our first Pupil Free Day will be held on Friday the 10th of March. This day will be utilised by us to further develop our skills and knowledge in the teaching of reading for students from Reception-Year 6. We will be working with staff from other sites to learn about improved practice, influenced by the latest research.

Future Pupil Free dates and School Closure Day will be arrived at after consultation with the newly elected Governing Council (22/2/23) and staff.

#### **NAPLAN Testing**

This year, the NAPLAN test will be held earlier than normal. Usually, these tests are conducted early in Term 2, but in 2023, they will be conducted between and including the dates 15/3/23 - 24/3/23. These tests are for Year 3 and Year 5 students.

It is expected that all students will sit the tests, except for those withdrawn by parents (usually for philosophical reasons) or those exempted by the Principal (with parent/guardian permission), due to the fact that the student has major

learning/behavioural/physical needs which makes the test difficult to administer and/or is unlikely to provide new, relevant information.

Further information will come home to Year 3/5 students and their families in the next two weeks.

#### **Acquaintance Night**

Our school Acquaintance Night will be held this Wednesday the 8th of February (please see attached timetable). It is earlier this year due to staff being away next week to attend training and development.

#### **Water Safety Lessons**

We have recently found out that we have been lucky to secure a coordinator and instructors so that water safety lessons can occur this term. Notes with detailed information and consent forms were sent out last week.

The Year 3/4 classes will attend lessons on Wednesday-Friday of this week and Monday-Friday of Week 3. The Reception-Year 2 students will attend swimming lessons Monday-Friday of Week 3.

The Year 5/6 students will participate in their water safety and aquatics lessons while on camp in Weeks 5 and 6.

Students will need to pack bathers, a towel, a sun-safe top, sunscreen, hat, goggles (optional) and medication if required.

Please contact your child's teacher if you are able to accompany the class while they walk to and from the swimming pool. This helps to ensure the safety of our students and is a great opportunity to watch your child enjoy their lessons.
