## A NOTE FROM THE AUSTISM INCLUSION TEACHER

I am excited to be Bordertown Primary Schools Autism Inclusion Teacher and I look forward to working in this role to best support our learners with diverse needs.

Autism Inclusion Teachers are a new, nation-leading initiative that aims to build understanding and knowledge to support autistic children and young people.

Focus of the AIT role

- Provide support to their fellow educators on how to best support and educate students with autism.
- Drive improved practice relating to autism that works for their school.

The AIT role does not include working directly with students with autism, nor are they involved in student or parent conferences. It is anticipated that Autism Inclusion Teachers will first build their own teaching expertise, knowledge and understanding of autism through engaging in formal learning offerings and participation in the Autism Inclusion Teacher networks.

To improve knowledge and practice across the school, Autism Inclusion Teachers will then be encouraged to share their learnings and resources with their colleagues to utilise in teaching autistic children and young people in their own classes.


