Playground Update

Our playground committee has been busy developing a sustainable, strategic plan for the maintenance and development of our school play areas.

The first job for the committee was to ensure our current playground equipment and surrounding areas were made safe following a Kidsafe audit.

To date we have identified, removed and repaired our existing equipment in both the playgrounds. Thanks to Jarradd Searle and Ciampa Engineering for completing this work.

The bridge in the Woods playground will be replaced by Forpark Australia in the coming months.





Our plan is then to replace damaged edging and relocate some of the existing edging around the equipment. Then we will relocate and/or replace softfall. Our scope isn't limited to just the playground areas. Maintenance has begun on the courts at the back of the school and the play areas on the eastern side of the quadrangle.

Consultation has begun with staff and students to identify what the needs/wants are for play areas and equipment. When designs have been created, we will share these with you.

Students in the Reception to year 2 classes have been busy collecting bottles and cans for new playground equipment. Kids Voice are also fundraising for playground equipment.

We are expecting to complete the development of the new play areas in stages, to spread the cost over several years, exploring other funding opportunities.
