



# PLAYGROUND OPENING





Art makes you feel good, promotes positive self-esteem and self-expression.

Art stimulates creativity and problem-solving skills, while encouraging the mind to be present.

### FROM OUR PASTORAL CARE WORKER

Welcome back! I'm not sure about your household, but in ours, the back-to-school grind has hit hard. I find going back to school so difficult during summer....summer nights are often the nicest part of the day to be outside in the cool as the sun is setting, but instead it is now consumed with trying to get kids fed and into bed.

Do you find your kids irritable and maybe even angry or frustrated after school? Do you feel like you are walking around on eggshells waiting for the next explosion? Hard work, isn't it!

Take comfort in knowing this is normal! Often our children have been trying their hardest all day at school, with teachers, with friends, with other children they may not know very well, and this can be exhausting for them, physically and mentally. So when they re-enter the safe place that is home, they feel safe enough to let all those feelings and emotions out.

That 10 minutes when your child/ren re-enter the home is the optimal time to reconnect with them. Sit with them, let them tell you about their day. Often that 10 minutes spent well reconnecting at this time of the day will lay the foundation for the tea and bed routine that soon follows. If a child feels validated, loved, heard and needed, and has a safe space to let those feelings out, its all they need to settle back into home life. Below are some conversation starters you might like to try with your children. Maybe cut them out, stick them on the fridge or on the kitchen table to help that reconnection time after school.
